We are holding an “antidote to winter” day next week on Thursday 17th to cheer us all up in the cold, dark days of January. The classes will all be focusing upon extra lessons as part of the work we do in teaching Spanish as a foreign language. I invite all the children to wear bright (ideally yellow and red) clothes instead of their uniforms.
