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What makes us special?

Development matters

Can describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities. Children talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members. They know that other children don't always enjoy the same things, and are sensitive to this. They know about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions.

Early Learning Goals

Children are confident to try new activities, and say why they like some activities more than others. They are confident to speak in a familiar group, will talk about their ideas, and will choose the resources they need for their chosen activities. They say when they do or don't need help.

Exceeding Early Learning Goals

Children are confident to speak to a class group. They can talk about the things they enjoy, and are good at, and about the things they don't find easy. They are resourceful in finding support when they need help or information. They can talk about the plans they have made to carry out activities and what they might change if they were to repeat them. They know that other children have different likes and dislikes and that they may be good at different things. They understand that different people have different beliefs, attitudes, customs and traditions and why it is important to treat them with respect.

Coverage

- Talking about similarities and differences between people. Discussing what makes us different, what we are good at.
- Talk about how we celebrate events, what we celebrate and the differences between people.
- Talk about things that we don't find as easy and what can be done to resolve that.
